



The Borough of Elverson
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FEE SCHEDULE

Adopted February 6, 2007

1. ZONING PERMIT FEES

- A. All accessory structures 1,000 SF and less without a utility connector are required to have only a zoning permit. The permit fee shall be \$50.
- B. A zoning permit is required in conjunction with every material change in the use of land. The zoning permit fee is \$50.

2. BUILDING PERMIT FEES

A. ONE AND TWO FAMILY RESIDENTIAL

- 1. New construction - \$.25/SF of building or structure area, including porches, patios, attics, basements, garages and living areas. Crawl spaces and dead area spaces (areas with less than minimum height ceilings such as kneewalls) are excluded. There is a minimum permit fee of \$300.
- 2. For residential additions including attached garages, the minimum building permit fee is \$250. Structures exceeding 1,000 square feet, including porches, patios, attics, basement, garages, and living areas will be calculated at \$.25/SF.
- 3. For garages 200 SF and over, accessory structures 200 SF and over, and decks, \$.25/SF of building or structure area (total area, each level) is charged. There is a minimum permit fee of \$150.
- 4. For private swimming pools over 24 inches in depth, \$.25/SF of structure area, including surrounding patio/deck is charged. There is a minimum permit fee of \$150.
- 5. Where none of the above categories apply, \$.25/SF of building or structure area (areas with at least minimum height ceilings). There is a minimum building permit fee of \$100.
- 6. The building permit renewal fee is \$30.
- 7. Demolition permit - \$25 for each \$1,000 of demolition costs. The minimum fee is \$100.

8. Signs - \$50/sign.
9. Driveway - \$25.
10. Additional or re-inspections will be billed to the applicant on a per inspection basis. The fee for each inspection will be \$50.
11. Permits for replacement of 25% or greater of roof area \$50.

B. NON-RESIDENTIAL AND RESIDENTIAL OTHER THAN ONE AND TWO FAMILY USES

1. Escrow Fund – Upon submission of an application for a permit to the Borough by an applicant for a multi-family residential, commercial, industrial, educational or an institutional building permit, the Building Code Official of the Borough shall require the applicant to submit construction plans to enable the Building Code Official to make a good faith estimate of the total cost to inspect the building during the construction of the building. The Building Code Official shall also itemize the various inspection stages which shall include itemizing each stage and the description thereof and the estimated number of inspections in each stage. The applicant shall pay the estimated amount into the Escrow Fund. The applicant shall have a right to request the Council to review any estimate in excess of \$2,000 and the Council shall have the right to either confirm or decrease the Escrow Fund.
2. Actual Permit Fee – the building permit fee for multi-family residential, commercial, industrial, educational or an institutional building shall be equal to 125% of the building inspector hourly inspection rate set annually, for each hour or part of an hour, plus mileage at the prevailing irs rate and other expenses, which the code official employed by theborough shall be required to expend in reviewing and inspecting the various stages of construction to assure compliance with the requirement of all the codes in the Borough Of Elverson, Chester County, Pennsylvania.
3. Additions to or Refunds from Escrow Funds – the applicant for a building permit shall pay to the borough any amount by which the actual inspection fee as calculated in paragraph 2b exceeds the escrow fund. the borough shall refund to the applicant any amount by which the actual inspection fee as calculated in paragraph 2b is less than the escrow fund.

3. PLUMBING PERMIT FEES

A. ONE AND TWO FAMILY RESIDENTIAL

1. Manufactured dwelling with crawl space (includes mobile home on foundation) \$ 60
2. Single family dwelling (not over 3 full or partial baths) \$125
 Each additional full or partial bath per unit \$ 50

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| 3. Two-family dwelling (not over 2 full or partial baths per unit) | \$210 |
| Each additional full or partial bath per unit | \$ 50 |
4. Additional or re-inspections will be billed to the applicant on a per inspection basis of \$50/inspection.

B. NON-RESIDENTIAL AND RESIDENTIAL OTHER THAN ONE AND TWO FAMILY USES

1. Escrow Fund – Upon submission of an application for a permit to the Borough by an applicant for a multi-family residential, commercial, industrial, educational or an institutional plumbing permit, the Building Code Official of the Borough shall require the applicant to submit construction plans to enable the Building Code Official to make a good faith estimate of the total cost to inspect the plumbing during the construction of the building. The Building Code Official shall also itemize the various inspection stages which shall include itemizing each stage and the description thereof and the estimated number of inspections in each stage. The applicant shall pay the estimated amount into the Escrow Fund. The applicant shall have a right to request the Council to review any estimate in excess of \$1,000 and the Council shall have the right to either confirm or decrease the Escrow Fund.
2. Actual Permit Fee – The plumbing permit fee for multi-family residential, commercial, industrial, educational or an institutional building shall be equal to 125% of the building inspector hourly inspection rate set annually, for each hour or part of an hour, plus mileage at the prevailing IRS Rate and other expenses, which the code official employed by the Borough shall be required to expend in reviewing and inspecting the various stages of construction to assure compliance with the requirement of all the codes in the Borough of Elverson, Chester County, Pennsylvania.
3. Additions to or Refunds from Escrow Funds – The applicant for a plumbing permit shall pay to the Borough any amount by which the actual inspection fee as calculated in paragraph 2B exceeds the Escrow Fund. The Borough shall refund to the applicant any amount by which the actual inspection fee as calculated in paragraph 2B is less than the Escrow Fund.

B. NON-RESIDENTIAL AND RESIDENTIAL OTHER THAN ONE AND TWO FAMILY USES

1. Escrow Fund – Upon submission of an application for a permit to the Borough by an applicant for a multi-family residential, commercial, industrial, educational or an institutional electrical permit, the Building Code Official of the Borough shall require the applicant to submit construction plans to enable the Building Code Official to make a good faith estimate of the total cost to inspect the electrical installations during the construction of the building. The Building Code Official shall also itemize the various inspection stages which shall include itemizing each stage and the description thereof and the estimated number of inspections in each stage. The applicant shall pay the estimated amount into the Escrow Fund. The applicant shall have a right to request the Council to review any estimate in excess of \$1,000 and the Council shall have the right to either confirm or decrease the Escrow Fund.

2. Actual Permit Fee – The electrical permit fee for multi-family residential, commercial, industrial, educational or an institutional building shall be equal to 125% of the building inspector hourly inspection rate set annually, for each hour or part of an hour, plus mileage at the prevailing IRS Rate and other expenses, which the code official employed by the Borough shall be required to expend in reviewing and inspecting the various stages of construction to assure compliance with the requirement of all the codes in the Borough of Elverson, Chester County, Pennsylvania.

3. Additions to or Refunds from Escrow Funds – The applicant for a electrical permit shall pay to the Borough any amount by which the actual inspection fee as calculated in paragraph 2B exceeds the Escrow Fund. The Borough shall refund to the applicant any amount by which the actual inspection fee as calculated in paragraph 2B is less than the Escrow Fund.

C. MISCELLANEOUS ELECTRICAL FEES

5. MECHANICAL PERMIT FEES

A. NON-RESIDENTIAL

1. Escrow Fund – Upon submission of an application for a permit to the Borough by an applicant for a commercial, industrial, educational or an institutional mechanical permit, the Building Code Official of the Borough shall require the applicant to submit construction plans to enable the Building Code Official to make a good faith estimate of the total cost to inspect the mechanical components during the construction of the building. The Building Code Official shall also itemize the various inspection stages which shall include itemizing each stage and the description thereof and the estimated number of inspections in each stage. The applicant shall pay the estimated amount into the Escrow Fund. The applicant shall have a right to request the Council to review any estimate in excess of \$1,000 and the Council shall have the right to either confirm or decrease the Escrow Fund.

2. Actual Permit Fee – The mechanical permit fee for commercial, industrial, educational or an institutional building shall be equal to 125% of the building inspector hourly inspection rate set annually, for each hour or part of an hour, plus mileage at the prevailing IRS Rate and other expenses, which the code official employed by the Borough shall be required to expend in reviewing and inspecting the various stages of construction to assure compliance with the requirement of all the codes in the Borough of Elverson, Chester County, Pennsylvania.

3. Additions to or Refunds from Escrow Funds – The applicant for a mechanical permit shall pay to the Borough any amount by which the actual inspection fee as calculated in paragraph 2B exceeds the Escrow Fund. The Borough shall refund to the applicant any amount by which the actual inspection fee as calculated in paragraph 2B is less than the Escrow Fund.

6. MANDATED FEES
